Write Your Dissertation

What is a dissertation?

A dissertation (German: Doktorarbeit) is a scientific work, through which you can achieve the highest possible educational degree and thus the doctorate. Alternatively, this text is also referred to as a dissertation, doctorate, doctoral thesis, doctoral dissertation, or inaugural dissertation.



Let's be honest, writing a dissertation is a lot of work. It takes a tremendous amount of effort and time to write a really good paper. It must be said, there is nothing wrong with asking for help from specialized services that focus on dissertation writing. You can turn to this

Unlike a bachelor's or master's thesis, your supervisors (doctoral supervisors) expect you to gain new knowledge within the scope of your topic area as part of your research. Simply rewriting an old thesis is therefore not enough. The academic title "Dr." will be awarded to you after a successful disputation (defense) and publication of your work. By the way, you are only allowed to do a doctorate (i.e. write your dissertation) if you already have a master's degree, master's degree, diploma, or state examination in your pocket.

Reasons for writing a doctoral thesis

Whether in German studies, dentistry, or sociology: Writing your dissertation is not a task of one or two weeks. A doctoral thesis is usually much more extensive and involves a greater research effort than a term paper, bachelor's, or master's thesis. It is not uncommon for doctoral candidates to invest several years in their dissertation, for which there must be good reasons:

- The doctorate improves your career prospects and allows you to move up to management positions more quickly.
- Accordingly, graduates with doctoral degrees often earn more money than their colleagues with lower degrees.
- Those who get to write a doctoral dissertation can dive deep into a topic, often of their choosing, and explore it thoroughly. Many find their passion in this and become completely absorbed in it.
- If you have successfully mastered your dissertation, this will improve your overall impression. For example, organizational talent, stamina, discipline, and a strong analytical mind are attributed to you.

When it comes to dissertation writing, it is important to get help with the material in a timely manner. There are different opportunities to do this. Write your dissertation in 6 steps

Of course, it makes a huge difference whether you write your dissertation in medicine or linguistics. Nevertheless, there are certain stages that you will go through in this process and which we would like to present to you in more detail as a small directional guide.

1. Preparation

In the first step, you will take care of things that do not have too much to do with your dissertation itself. At least not with the writing process, but with the planning of a dissertation. First of all, you have to find a topic that you are interested in and that is feasible within the

framework of a dissertation (cf. Kornmeier, 2018). In the course of this, you will of course also need a supervisor who will accompany you on this path. Who is allowed to become a doctoral supervisor is defined in the doctoral regulations of your faculty, for example at the University of Marburg. You also have to take care of the financing of your doctorate. Once all this is in place, you can start working on your first outline in consultation with your supervisor.

2. Research & Investigation

Now it starts! You will spend a large part of your time on research your research. These form the basis of your dissertation and must be carried out thoroughly, conscientiously, and extensively. Because, you must not forget, in the end, you have to enrich the research field with your findings. By the way, the use of databases is indispensable (cf. Sonnentag, 2016). So: research the literature and get started!

3. Writing

Depending on the discipline, topic, and working method, the step of research and investigation may mix with the actual writing. Together they form the most time-consuming part of your doctorate. After all, you are not only doing active, scientific research, but you also have to write it down and make your findings accessible to others. Make sure that your text is written in a scientific style. Proper citation is also super important.

4. Review & Perfect

The last sentence is written, the footnotes are complete, and the literature management is finished. Please don't hand it in yet and in any case, read over your thesis again within a few day's distances! Think about how much time, sleepless nights, and effort you have put into your text! What a pity it would be if the whole thing fails because of avoidable spelling mistakes or a bad layout. Especially because you have put a lot of work into your dissertation, we recommend professional proofreading of your dissertation.

5. Submission & Disputation

Are you completely satisfied with your work? Then all that's left to do is print it, submit it in the correct form, and write your thesis. Now don't lose your motivation and finish the whole thing!

6. Publication

To receive your doctorate, you now have to publish your dissertation. This works as a cumulative dissertation, in a monograph, as an online publication, print version, in a publishing house or you simply publish it yourself. At LMU Munich you have one year from the announcement of the final grade. Congratulations, you may now present yourself with your doctorate.
